Minutes of the First Meeting of SOUTH WALES BRANCH of GEOLOGISTS' ASSOCIATION, held at the Department of Geology, University College, Cardiff on Saturday January 23rd 1960.

The meeting was opened by Professor J.G. C. Anderson, who welcomed the members to the first assembly of the newly formed group, and also expressed his pleasure at the large number present. He said that people had long felt the need of a branch of the Geologists' Association in South Wales, and that the Geologists' Association had been only too pleased to recognise this new local group. He was pleased to inform the members that he had also received a telegram of good wishes from the Midland Group which was celebrating its 21st Anniversary,

Professor Anderson then spoke briefly about the aims of the newly formed group and outlined the history of its formation. The present movement had stemmed from two preliminary meetings at the University Colleges of Cardiff and Swansea respectively, and the subsequent establishment of a Preliminary Committee to make recommendations, and to take the first steps in the formation of the Group.

Professor Anderson then put to the meeting the Committee's recommendation that Dr. D. A. Bassett of the National Museum of Wales be elected Chairman. The adoption of the recommendation was proposed by Mr. Walter Jones (Penarth Grammar School) and seconded by Mr. A. J. Thomas (Barry Grammar School) and was carried unanimously. Dr. Bassett was then invited to occupy the chair.

- The Chairman thanked the meeting for its warm welcome and then outlined the recommendations of the Committee which should continue to act until April.
- a. <u>Structure of the Committee</u>. The committee should consist of a Chairman, Vice-chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Excursion Secretary and six Ordinary members. The adoption of this recommendation was proposed by Mr. W.Jenkins (Llanelly Boys Grammar School) and seconded by Mr. R.Cooper (Howardian High School).

Acceptance was proposed by Mr. D. Protheroe Davies (Port Talbot) and seconded by W.J. Griffiths, and was carried unanimously. At this point it was suggested by the Chairman that additional members of the Committee be elected by the meeting. It was proposed and accepted that the additional members be Professor J.G.C. Anderson

and Mr. Basil Isaac (Treforest School of Mines). The Chairman stated that meetings would be held monthly and alternately at Cardiff and Swansea, and that there should be the possibility of meetings at other centres in South Wales.

- 3. The Chairman now introduced Professor David Williams, who, he said, was a very appropriate choice for the first lecturer, since he was both a Welshman and the President of the Geologists' Association.
- 4. In his capacity as President, Professor Williams brought the good wishes of the Geologists Association of London.
- 5. The lecture entitled "Prospecting for Minerals" was then delivered by Professor Williams. The lecture proved comprehensive and well illustrated, and dealt with all aspects of mineral prospecting from the early days of gold panning, to the intricate modern techniques employing geophysical and geochemical techniques.
- A vote of thanks was proposed on behalf of the meeting by Mr. T,R. Owen, University College, Swansea. Incorporated in Mr. Owen's remarks was his expression of pleasure at the manner in which people in Eastern and Western parts of South Wales had been able to co-operate in this new venture, which had so long been necessary.
- 7. The Chairman, Dr. D.A. Bassett, added his thanks to that of the proposer and expressed the wish that Professor David Williams would return in the near future to discuss the possibility of applying the modern techniques which he had described to the exploration for minerals in North Wales.

MINUTES OF THE SECOND MEETING, held at the DEPARTMENT OF GEOLOGY, UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, SWANSEA, on Saturday February 13th 1960, by kind permission of Professor F.H.T. RHODES.

- 1. The meeting was opened by the Chairman who expressed his pleasure at the large number present. The Chairman then drew attention to the circulating attendance sheets and asked that all present should sign them. In addition the sheets used at the first meeting were still available and it was hoped that those who had not signed them in Cardiff might do so now, in order to preserve a complete record of the attendance at this historic first meeting. The Chairman mentioned that it was hoped that as many people as possible would become members of the Parent Association, and for this purpose proposal forms ware available in the meeting.
- 2. <u>Minutes.</u> The minutes of the first meeting held at Cardiff on January 23rd were read and approved. Proposed Mr. A.J. Thomas. Seconded Mr.B. Norris.
- 3. The Chairman in inviting Professor J.G.C. Anderson to deliver his lecture entitled "The Geology of South East Wales with special reference to the Cardiff district", remarked how appropriate it was that the Professor should be the lecturer because he was one of the prime movers in the formation of this group, and that the subject was also appropriate because this year the British Association will be visiting Cardiff in September.
- 4. The lecture was now delivered by Professor Anderson and in his introductory remarks he informed the meeting that he had received goodwill messages from the Geologists' Association of London as well as from the Geological Society of the University College of Cardiff. After the introduction in which he delimited the boundaries of the area under review Professor Anderson dealt with the geological exposures of South Wales in their stratigraphical sequence. We thus had an account of rocks and structures whose ages ranged from the Middle and Upper Silurian to the Lower Liassic, and in addition of the more recent superficial deposits, glacial, marine and alluvial. The lecture was illustrated by maps, photographs and diagrams.
- 5. A vote of thanks was proposed on behalf of the meeting by Professor F.H.T. Rhodes. In thanking Professor Anderson for his comprehensive and informative lecture, Professor Rhodes endorsed the chairman's remarks concerning the lecturer's great interest in initiating the work leading to the formation of the Group.
- 6. The Chairman seconded the vote of thanks and stated that at the next meeting Professor Rhodes would be the lecturer.

Two preliminary meetings of teachers and other persons interested in the formation in South Wales of a geological group took place in late 1959. These were - at Cardiff for eastern South Wales on 7 November, convened and chaired by Professor JCC Anderson, University college Cardiff and at Swansea for western South Wales on 21 November, convened and chaired by Brian Simpson, University college of Swansea; both meetings were held in the respective department of geology. A Preliminary Committee was subsequently set up to seek the approval of the parent body of the Geologists' Association to form a South Wales group and to take the first steps in its formation. At its-only-meeting on 4 December 1959 in the department of geology of University college, Cardiff (then in premises on Newport road) the Preliminary Committee was chaired by Professor JGC Anderson and its membership comprised of - Mr G Askey (National museum of Wales), Dr DA Bassett (National museum of Wales), Dr RCK Blundell (University college, Cardiff), Miss KA Goskar (Neath girls grammar school), Mr DB Norris (Swansea junior technical college), Mr TR Owen (University college of Swansea) Am R Parsons (Caerphilly boys grammar technical school), Mr B Simpson (University college of Swansea) and Mr DJW Thomas (Canton boys high school Cardiff). The Preliminary Committee prepared a series of recommendations (subsequently to be accepted almost in their entirety) that outlined the functions and structure of the new group and made arrangements for the holding of the Geologists Association

The first meeting of the South Wales group of the Geologists Association was held on Saturday 25 January 1960 in the department of geology of University college Cardiff. The meeting was opened by the chairman of the Preliminary Committee (Professor JGC Anderson) who in welcoming the audience of over one hundred referred to the longfelt need for a geological organisation in South Wales and drew attention to the telegram of congratulations received from the Midland group (then celebrating its 21st anniversary). Professor Anderson put to the meeting the first of the recommendations of the Preliminary Committee namely the election of a chairman of the group and of members of a committee including the offices of treasurer, secretary and field excursions secretary. The adoption of the first recommendation was proposed by Mr W Jones (Penarth grammar school) and seconded by Mr AJ Thomas (Barry boys grammar technical school) and there was then an unanimous election as the group's first chairman of Dr Douglas A Bassett, Keeper of geology at the National museum of Wales. The first full committee consisted of as vicechairman, Professor Frank HT Rhodes (University college of Swansea); as treasurer, Mr Roland Parsons; as secretary, Mr George Askey; as field excursions secretary, Mr Trevor M Thomas (Ministry of housing and local government Cardiff); as ordinary members, Professor JGC Anderson, Dr RCK Blundell, Miss Kate Goskar, Mr Basil Isaac (Treforest school of mines), Miss Gwyneth Meara (Bassaleg grammar school Newport) and Mr TR Owen. The first annual general meeting took place on Tuesday 5 April 1960 at 6 p.m. in the department of geology at University college of Swansea when the chairman gave an address on "The history of Lower Palaeozoic research in Wales with particular reference to the Cambrian rocks of Merioneth".

In concluding the more formal business of its first-short session the group re-elected as its chairman for the next two sessions Dr Douglas Bassett, re-elected its treasurer, secretary and field excursion secretary, made in addition to Professor FHT Rhodes two further vice-chairmen in Professor JGC Anderson and Mr DB Norris, elected as assistant secretary Mr WS Morgan (Neath technical college), and to the list of ordinary members of the original committee (all re-elected) added the names of Miss G Groom (University college of Swansea). Miss MI Roberts (Llanelli girls grammar school) and Mr DJW Thomas (Canton boys high school Cardiff). This was the composition of the committee for the group's first full session (1960-1961) which opened on 1 September 1960 with the group helping to host Section C (geology) of the British Association for the Advancement of Science at its annual meeting for 1960 held in Cardiff.

During the remainder of its first session the group established another important element of its activities by holding for its members field excursions; on 9th April the first to Ogmore by Sea, was led by the late TM (Trevor) Thomas and two weeks later on 23rd April the leader (to the 'head of the Vale of Neath' - where else?) was Mr TR (Dick) Owen.

During the 1965-1966 session the idea of a regularly issued publication as a means of communication with members - initially promoted by Mr JNM Firth (Midland Silicones 1td) was taken up and bore fruit with the publication of the Welsh geological quarterly. Under the editorship of of Dr DA Bassett the journal appeared during the period 1965 to 1870; subscribers included many universities in the UK, several bodies in the USA, others in Europe (including one in the USSR) and in Australia. Publication by the group of an occasional series commenced in 1971 (during the chairmanship of the late Mr TM Thomas) when coincident with the holding at Swansea of the annual meeting of the British Association for the Advancement of Science there was published the volume Geological excursions in South Wales and the Forest of Dean; edited by Drs DA Bassett and MG Bassett (both National Euseum of Wales) the two hundred and sixty seven page volume contained itineraries prepared by nineteen authors for twenty one field excursions in the region. It sold widely and all two and a half thousand copies were sold by 1979. The profits enabled the group is share in the financing of a second volume in the occasional series; for both volumes the bulk of the costs of printing, binding and publishing were borne by the principal distributors. Dr Michael G Bassett, editor of the group since 1974, produced for publication by the National museum of Wales in 1982 Geological excursions in Dyfed, South-West Wales; in a format similar to the first volume (but, with three hundred and twenty seven pages, almost 25% longer) it bore the imprint of the group and consisted of itineraries prepared by twenty four authors for nineteen field excursions in the former counties of Cardigan, Carmarthen and Pembroke.
