This section includes Annual Reports sent to the Geologists' Association (GA) in London.

The GA works to a calendar year, but the SWGA's year is usually from March to February. Therefore, at the end of each calendar year, the Group sends an Annual Report to the GA, which in turn brings the reports of all the Local Groups of the GA (the South Wales Group being one of these) into its own annual GA report and compilation.

Report of the hon secretary of 1988 activities; to be presented in person, at the GA Council Meeting of Friday 4 November 1988.

The programme began explosively with Dr Peter Styles describing (but not demonstrating) rock 'bursts' in the mines of the anthracite district of the South Wales coalfield.

An audience of over a hundred, (including members of other societies) was on the edge of its collective seat when Dr Beverly Halstead's description of dinosaurian life-styles included a demonstration of some of the lesser-known positions adopted by the more laid-back members among the dinosaurs.

Dr Tony Ramsay gave the Retiring Chairman's address on problems of the Carboniferous Limestone of South Wales the digestion of which was aided by the pleasant lunch that followed.

Dr Geraint Owen led a field excursion into south Dyfed (Llanstephan and Amroth) and Dr Michael Bassett a weekend field excursion to the Malverns, both in pleasant Spring weather. The Student Lecture for 1988 (the first) was splendidly delivered by Professor David Bowen (currently New College London, but soon to head at University College of Wales Aberystwyth the newly-formed broad-spectrum Institute of Earth Studies).

Another - but depressing - sign of the times in the world of higher education was the UGC "thumbs-down" on the future of the department of Earth science at University College of Swansea - so the Group's western venue may be in jeopardy.

Unreported in the annual report for 1987 but an omission the secretary is pleased now to correct was the appearance in <u>Proc geol ass</u>, vol 98, part 4 (December 1987) of "Geology and sediments of offshore Wales and adjacent areas" being mainly the papers read at the symposium held by the Group on 15 February 1986. This was the second of the symposia arranged by the Group to be published in the <u>Proceedings</u>.

A third symposium (on Paleobiology in Wales) will be held on 11 March 1989 and it is the intention to offer its papers for possible publication by the Association.

SOUTH WALES GROUP REPORT FOR 1990

The South Wales Group's year runs from September to September, so this period includes parts of the 1989/90 and 1990/91 sessions.

Early 1990 saw the sad death of Prof. T.R. (Dick) Owen, a past Chairman and Honorary Member of the Group, after illness. He will be missed by all.

Despite the closure of the Department of Geology at Swansea, which was finally effected this year, there is a strong core of members in the Swansea area, and meetings will continue to be held in Swansea as well as Cardiff.

During the 1989/90 session there were 63 paid-up Ordinary Members, plus 2 Honorary Members. Membership for 1990/91 is already over 70, and several new initiatives have been taken to try and attract new members.

At the Annual General Meeting in March, Alun Thomas was awarded Honorary Membership and, having stepped down as Secretary in 1989 after 23 years, took over as Chairman for the period 1990-1992. After an even longer period - 31 years - as the only Treasurer in the Group's history, Roland Parsons also stepped down, to be replaced by Tom Sharpe. Nigel Roberts resigned as Secretary, and was replaced by Geraint Owen, who was replaced as Field Secretary by John Cope. Lynda Garfield and Bryn Lewis retired from the Committee, their places being taken by Jim Chetcuti, Peter Hodges and Mike Lees.

At a Special General Meeting held before the Annual General Meeting subscriptions were increased to £5.00 for Ordinary Members and £1.00 for Student Members. This is the first increase for 8 years.

There will have been 7 lecture meetings during the year. Mike Benton started the year off with a talk on Rhynchosaurs, attended by 39 at Swansea. In February, Dick Aldridge talked on the thermal history of Wales before 20 people in Cardiff. The Annual General Meeting in Swansea in March was followed by Alan Stevens' Chairman's Address, attended by 32 - an account of Black Country geology through an engineer's eyes. The 1990/91 session got under way in October with Tim Palmer talking on Hard Bottoms, attended by 24 people in Swansea. In November, the third annual Student Lecture will be given by Peter Styles on earthquakes, and Bruce Sellwood will talk on the stratigraphical evolution and petroleum geology of southern England. This should be a useful precursor to our April field weekend to southern England. Finally, Jake Hancock will talk in December on the geology of wine production. We hope to follow this with a wine and snacks buffet.

There will have been 3 field meetings in the year. Peter Sheldon led a group of 22 around the Builth-Llandridod inlier on a hot, sunny day in March, which provided excellent conditions for finding trilobites and considering their evolution. Only 3 people came to the head of the Neath Valley in June, and the weekend excursion to the Isle of Wight, planned for May, had to be cancelled for lack of interest. A trip to Barry is planned for early November, including a tour of NERC's research ship, and has over a dozen registrants.

August 1990 saw the British Association for the Advancement of Science's annual meeting - Science 90 - held in Swansea. The overall theme was 'The Environment'. The Group organised a Mason Conference - a day of lectures - on Palaeoclimates, which was well attended and proved a most stimulating and interesting day. The Group also organised several field trips at the start of the week. Despite some cancellations from the original programme, trips were held on Sunday to the Gower, the Pembroke peninsula and Carmarthen Bay, and on Monday to Fishguard, and to the Swansea and Neath Valleys. During the week Eric Robinson led 2 most successful tours, to a local cemetery and to the city centre. In general the week was a success and was well attended and supported by Group members.

The South Wales Group has had a successful year in 1991. Membership has risen from 63 in September 1990 to 112 at the end of the 1990/91 session, and currently stands at 112, with more expected before the current session ends in September 1992. Membership includes 2 Honorary Members, but just 15 Student Members: we hope the new RockWATCH scheme may bring us more young members. Subscriptions remained unchanged at £5 for Ordinary Members, £1 for Student Members and senior citizens, and we introduced a family rate of £2.50 for each further adult at the same address as an Ordinary Member. Members receive a regular newsletter. During the summer we produced a new membership leaflet and have had about 30 new members since.

7 lecture meetings were held in 1991. On 19 January Dr K Pickering spoke on the evolution of lapetus to an audience of 35 in Cardiff. On 16 February Dr E Hailwood spoke on magnetic polarity reversals to an audience of 24 in Swansea. Our Annual General Meeting was held on 9 March in Cardiff and was followed by a lecture from Prof RSJ Sparks on "Volcanoes of the Andes", attended by 45 people. The 1991/92 session got under way on 19 October in Cardiff with a lecture from Dr D McCarroll on "The Glaciation in Wales: a Return to the Flood?" which 30 people attended. Our annual Student Lecture was held on the evening of 6 November in Cardiff. About 60 young and old students listened to Dr A Charig talk on "Dinosaur Extinctions". An audience of 30 heard Dr D Bassett talk on "Wales and Geology" in Swansea on 16 November and the final lecture of the year was given by Dr R King in Cardiff on 7 December, on the mineralogy of the Caldbeck Fells in Cumbria, attended by 32. Refreshments were provided before each lecture meeting, and wine and snacks after those in March and December.

5 field meetings have been held. On 23 February Drs J Cope and R Bevins led a group of 12 to the Precambrian rocks of the Llangynog Inlier, west of Carmarthen. On 14 April Dr G Owen led 20 members of the South Wales Group and the Open University Geological Society Severnside Branch along the Carmarthen Bay coast from Pendine to Amroth. After several years of having to be cancelled the Group's spring weekend was again a success, largely due to publicity in the GA Circular. About 20 people spent a weekend in Dorset under the guidance of Dr J Cope. On 1 June Dr E Robinson gave a talk in Cardiff followed by a tour of Cathays Cemetery. Finally, on 30 November, 32 people were led by Mr D Hawley around the Old Red Sandstone of the Talgarth area, including the Brecknock Wildlife Trust Geology Group's geology trail at Pwll y Wrach.

The most active "week" of the year was Welsh Geology Week, which saw talks, walks and exhibitions throughout the Principality between 4th and 14th July. Many members were involved in organising and attending events and 19 new members were recruited. The week was a great success and it is hoped that it will be repeated in some form.

Members are still awaiting publication of the Group's guide to the geology of Powys and the GA guide to the Swansea region. Both of these are now close to completion.

The current session continues until September 1992 and highlights still to come include a lecture on the natural history of the mammoth, to be followed by a viewing of the National Museum of Wales' "Mammoths and the Ice Age" exhibition, the Annual General Meeting with Mr Alun Thomas's Chairman's Address, and more field meetings including a weekend in North Wales and a visit to the new M4 cutting near Swansea.

This has been a successful year for the South Wales Group, spanning our 33rd and 34th sessions. 8 lecture meetings have been held at University College Swansea, University of Wales College of Cardiff and the National Museum of Wales: Prof D T Herbert, Prof M Brooks and Dr M G Bassett are thanked for their support of our activities. Membership reached 146 at the end of the 1991/92 session in March, and currently stands at 151. Subscriptions are unchanged at £5 for Ordinary Members, £1 for senior citizens and students. Members received 5 newsletters during the calendar year.

ANNUAL REPORT 2008

The Group's annual session follows the Academic year so this report covers the latter half of 2007-08 and the first half of the 2008-09 sessions. Like the parent body, the Group celebrated a special anniversary when in September 2008 we began our 50th Session. A number of publicity and fund raising events were held to help mark this anniversary, in addition to the usual programme of lectures and field meetings. Membership remained fairly steady and at the end of year totalled 179.

Indoor Meetings: During 2008 the Group held five indoor lecture meetings, in Swansea and Cardiff Universities. January - Dorset's Diana, Mary Anning (1799-1847) of Lyme Regis; "the greatest fossilist the world ever knew"? (Hugh Torrens); February - Stratigraphy of the Fishguard area (Huw Sheppard); March - Presidential Address: John MacCulloch and William Smith: the men and their maps (Tom Sharpe); October - Geology and Mineralisation of the Central Wales Orefield (David James); December - 150 Years of the Geologists' Association (Eric Robinson).

In January the highly popular annual *Holiday Geology* meeting was held in the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff, hosted by the Department of Geology, at which eight members gave short illustrated talks.

Field Meetings: During the year five full day and two weekend field meetings were held. Full day meetings were held in: April - Aust and Portishead (Peter Hodges and Geraint Owen); June - The Quaternary of Gower (John Hiemstra); August - Saundersfoot to Waterwynch, Pembrokeshire (Sid Howells); September - The Woolhope Inlier (Bob Owens). Weekend field meetings were held in March - The Gash Breccias of the Bullslaughter Bay and Pembroke Synclines (Peter Walsh and Sid Howells) and in October - The Variscan stratigraphy and tectonics of North Cornwall (Ted Freshney).

In addition the Group hosted a weekend field meeting for *Rockwatch* in June. On the Saturday we visited Big Pit, National Coal Museum, and old opencast pits at Blaenafon on the Sunday Lavernock and the Bendricks in the Vale of Glamorgan.

Events: The Group took part in a number of events during the year, the most important of which was *Geofest*, a major public orientated event held at the National Museum of Wales in November, which was the Group's regional contribution to the Association's 150th Anniversary celebrations. During the day over 1700 people visited the museum to take part in the range of geological activities on offer. These included two lectures - *Grave secrets of the dinosaurs* (Phil Manning) and *Mmmagma: Edible demonstrations of volcanic processes* (Alison Rust) both of which had large audiences. The event was supported by a number of other groups and organisations including the GA groups from Kent and West of England, *Rockwatch*, the Open University Geological Society, BGS, CCW and the Geology Department of the National Museum of Wales. The Group is grateful to the Curry Fund for a grant towards the costs of hosting this event.

The Group was invited to take part in two other local events. In June we attended the *Penarth Festival of the Sea* where we produced a display on the local geology and provided a rock, fossil and mineral identification service. In August we attended the annual *Out of the Woods* festival, run by the Cardiff Parks Department in Bute Park, Cardiff where we manned our highly popular Coal Measures fossil bash.

The Group also attended the Annual Reunion in London in November.

Publications: During the year the Group produced four *Newsletters* and work proceeded on two further editions of *Walking the Rocks*; one covering Pembrokeshire and the other further sites along the Glamorgan coast both of which we hope to publish in 2009. Work on the *Building Stones of Newport* leaflet by Eric Robinson reached the final phases and is due for publication early in 2009.

Geoconservation: Following on from the Group's involvement in the survey of geological sites within Cardiff a South Wales RIGS group has been established of which the Group is a constituent member.

ANNUAL REPORT 2009

This report covers the latter part of the 2008-09 session (our 50th) and the first part of that for 2009-10.

In September 2008 the Group began its 50th Session. As the very first session only lasted a few months (the first AGM was in March 1960), it was decided to hold the main 50th celebratory event on Saturday 23rd January 2010, exactly 50 years to the day of the founding of the group and the first lecture.

Publicity and fund raising have continued during the year to help mark this anniversary, in addition to the usual programme of lectures and field meetings. Membership continued to be steady and at the end of the 50th session (March 2009) totalled 179.

Indoor Meetings: During 2009 the Group held six indoor lecture meetings, in Swansea and Cardiff Universities. January – *The geology and natural hazards of Papua New Guinea* (Stephen Edwards); February – *Why protect the rocks?* (Joanne Venus); March – AGM: *The Old Red Sandstone of South Wales* (Brian Williams); October – *Supercontinent Disunited: why did America reject Wegener's big idea?* (Ted Nield); November – *Permian and Triassic mineralisation in the rocks of South-west England* (Richard Scrivenor) December – *Reflections on 50 years of geological change* (John Cope).

In January the highly popular annual *Holiday Geology* meeting was held in the National Waterfront Museum, Swansea, at which 8 members gave short illustrated talks.

Field Meetings: During the year seven full day field meetings were held, in: April – Rudry (Tom Sharpe); May – North-west Carmarthenshire (John Davies); June – Chedworth (David Owen); July – Exploring the landforms and de-glaciation of the Middle Usk Valley in the Abergavenny area (Adrian Humpage); August – Burrington Combe, Mendip (Andy Farrant); September – St Davids, Pembrokeshire (Dyfed Elis Gruffydd); November – Cwm Gwrelech and Sellar Opencast (Ben Evans).

Rockwatch: The Group hosted a Rockwatch Weekend in Carmarthenshire over the weekend of 11th-12th July. A total of 37 Rockwatch members and their families enjoyed the weekend that included a day of trilobite hunting.

Events: In August we again attended the annual *Out of the Woods Festival*, run by the Cardiff Parks Department in Bute Park, Cardiff, where we manned a stall including our highly popular Coal Measures fossil bash.

The Group also attended the Annual Reunion in London in November, highlighting both our 50th anniversary and the South Wales RIGS project.

Publications: During the year the Group produced four *Newsletters*, and work continued on two further editions of *Walking the Rocks*; one covering Pembrokeshire and the other further sites along the Glamorgan coast. The *Building Stones of Newport* leaflet, written by Eric Robinson, was published during the year.

Geoconservation: The South Wales RIGS Project (with the group as a constituent member) got underway early in the year with the appointment of SWGA member Rhian Hicks as Project Officer, based at the British Geological Survey office in Tongwynlais, Cardiff. The project has run several training sessions, at which numerous group members have attended. The write up of the Cardiff RIGS sites has been completed and Rhian has represented the group at meetings with Cardiff County Council.

Other: The Group was saddened by the deaths in November of two former Chairmen/Presidents; founder Chairman Douglas Bassett (Chairman 1960-1962) and Gareth Davies (President 1998-2000).
