

All will be delivered via Zoom and the link will be distributed to the membership a few days prior to the meetings. For those who wish there will be an on-line coffee/chat for about 30 minutes before the start of each meeting. For anybody who is unsure how to use Zoom there is a basic guide available on our web site.

Special Lecture: One plus to come out of this horrendous pandemic is that with lectures being delivered over the internet it is possible to have speakers from much farther afield than is normally practical and affordable. I am pleased to announce that one such speaker, Graham Leslie, from BGS in Edinburgh, has offered us a talk on Anglesey (thanks to Rhian's arm-twisting!) that was too good to miss. Accordingly, this has been arranged as a special mid-week lecture the details of which are as follows: **Tuesday 9th February:** *Recent advances in the understanding of the geology of Anglesey: a Caledonian cruise across Iapetus.* Graham Leslie (BGS Edinburgh). This meeting will start at **7.30pm** and will be preceded by the usual on-line coffee/chat beforehand.

I currently have two volunteers but need at least a further half dozen or so to make up a full programme. The talks can be prepared in the usual way as a Powerpoint presentation, and when it is your turn to speak you will be given the power by the host (Lesley Cherns) to share your screen with the rest of us and then you deliver your talk to your computer screen. If anybody is interested in volunteering but is unsure of the technical side please get in touch and we will sort you out.
