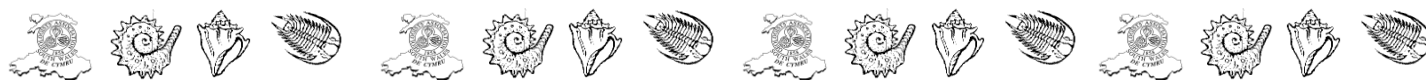

Summer programme 2013

Saturday 15th June: *Brecon Beacons*

Leader: John Davies

Is the Middle Devonian missing in south Wales? This excursion will provide a traverse from Cwm Graig Cerrig Gleisiad to the lower slopes of Fan Fawr through a section from the middle of the Senni Beds to the middle of the Brownstones, which displays excellent examples of changing palaeogeography in the rocks of the upper part of the Lower Devonian – or is it?

Meet at 10.30am at the car park at Cwm Graig Cerrig Gleisiad (SN 972 223) north of Storey Arms on the A470. Packed lunch essential. Total walking distance about 3 miles but there are some steep climbs.

Saturday 13th July: *Coln Gravel Pit, Cotswold Water Park*

Leader: Neville Hollingworth (Science & Technology Funding Council)

This is a joint meeting with the Bristol Naturalists' Society, Bath Geological Society and West of England GA.

This excursion gives a rare opportunity to see a highly fossiliferous sequence in the Oxford Clay with ammonites, molluscs, marine reptiles and overlying Terrace gravels with rich and diverse warm and cold stage mammoth fauna and an opportunity to find Palaeolithic hand axes.

Meet at the main quarry gates on the haul road through the yellow gates at Coln Gravel Works (SP 187 001) which lies approximately 2 miles east of Fairford on the A417 towards Lechlade. It is signposted to Hanson Coln Gravel and Bowmoor Sailing Lake. The gates will be open from 10:00am and we will have to leave quarry by 3pm. High Visibility vests are essential and Wellington boots are strongly recommended as it is likely to be very muddy. Bring a packed lunch.

Saturday 24th August: *Freshwater West and West Angle, Pembrokeshire*

Leader: John Nudds (Manchester University)

This excursion will examine the local succession from the Llanvirn to the Lower Carboniferous (Main Limestone), looking at the evidence for different depositional environments. There are a variety of rock types, interesting trace and body fossils plus classic folding and faulting for which the area has been designated an SSSI. Meet at 10.30am in the main car park at Freshwater West (SM 885 995). Either bring a packed lunch or lunch can be taken at the Hibernia Inn at West Angle. There are toilets at both Freshwater West and West Angle.

Saturday 21st September: *Mynydd Llangynidr, near Trefil*

Leader: Alan Bowring (Fforest Fawr Geopark)

Mynydd Llangynidr is a world-class interstratal karst site as recently recognised by its SSSI designation. The excursion will entail walking a circuit of many of the more interesting karstic features from Trefil, north past Llyn y Garn-fawr and Chartist Cave, passing from the Twrch Sandstone onto the limestone outcrop, and to the Neath Disturbance before heading back south in a circular fashion. The walk is approximately 9.5km/6miles although it can be varied on the day according to the weather and the inclinations of the group! We should be back at the cars for between 4pm and 5pm.

Meet at Trefil (SO 122 128) for a 10am start. To get there, turn right up the sweeping hill in the heart of Trefil village and park where the northwestern end of the former tram road (modern bridleway) meets the road at the top corner. Much of the area lies at around 1700ft /530m above sea level and is very exposed so it is essential to come prepared for inclement weather. A packed lunch is also required.

Saturday 26th October: *Llyn Brianne, Powys*

Leader: David Schofield (British Geological Survey)
