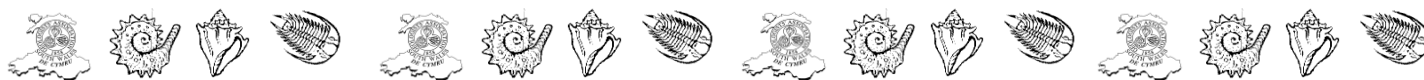

The Oxford Colloquium

The Oxford Colloquium is a one-day event based at the Oxford University Museum of Natural History. This exciting event gives you the opportunity to attend six lectures given by eminent speakers from distinguished UK academic and research institutions. The topics are drawn from across the Earth & planetary sciences. This year, despite the Museum being closed to the general public, the Oxford Colloquium will be held on Saturday March 16. The line-up of speakers is:

Professor J. Tellam (University of Birmingham)

'Nano particles in sandstone groundwaters'

Professor S. Conway Morris (University of Cambridge) 'The Cambrian explosion & re-running the tape of life: what really happens?'

Professor P. Burgess (Royal Holloway, University of London) 'Numbers, models and layered rocks: what can we learn from numerical modelling of sedimentary systems?'

Professor M. Siegert (University of Bristol) 'Exploration of sub-glacial Lake Ellsworth, West Antarctica.'

Dr. D. Waters (University of Oxford) 'Building Mount Everest: the inside story.'

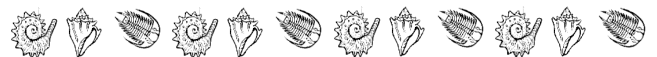
Dr. R. Walker (University of Oxford) 'Earthquakes on an urban world: challenges for the 21st Century.'

In addition there's some hands-on stuff: At lunchtime there will be a series of handling tables and live demonstrations. Professor P. Smith (Oxford) and Professor D. Siveter (Oxford) will be demonstrating specimens from the Sirius Passet and Chengjiang Cambrian lagerstätten. Dr. M Price will also be on hand to show-off the Wager Collection of metamorphic and igneous rock specimens.

RIGS

Members of the South Wales G. A. have for many years been involved in carrying out surveys of geological sites, initially in the Cardiff area and then more recently covering much of South East Wales supporting the British Geological Survey 's RIGS project. The completed RIGS survey work has been passed on to the Welsh Government and will be distributed to Local Authorities who will, hopefully, safeguard them via the planning system. Unlike Sites of Special Scientific Interest, administered by the Countryside Council for Wales, they still won't have statutory protection. Unfortunately this process doesn't allow for the restoration or enhancement of the very many sadly neglected geological sites.

In order to remedy this situation the first step has been taken to set up a RIGS Group, covering South East Wales, involving many South Wales G. A. members along with representatives of other relevant and interested organisations and other keen

supporters. This provides a marvellous opportunity for more supporters to get involved with this worthwhile project which will protect and safeguard our important geological heritage. The RIGS Group does have a wider remit with an important role to play as an educational resource, providing interpretative facilities and involving the wider public.

A further meeting has been convened for **Tuesday evening, 16 April at 7.00 pm at the Garwnant Forestry Centre**, just north of Merthyr Tydfil, to consider the next stage in determining the future direction of this exciting new project. So if you have an interest in protecting our geological heritage and want to take part in it, please come along and support the project. You will be most welcome. To succeed, the project requires plenty of support from people who can offer a wide range of different skills.
