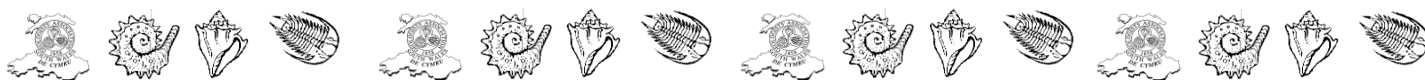

### Field Meetings Summer 2013

This summer's field meetings have been very well attended and we have enjoyed some excellent weather. Unfortunately, due to circumstances beyond our control, the Cotswold Water Park meeting in July had to be cancelled at the last minute but Allan Cuthbertson came to our rescue and kindly volunteered to lead an excursion to Kenfig and Sker Rock, where he had us debating whether or not the dome-like structures that he and Ann had found in the Trias were stromatolites. As usual Allan had gone to a lot of trouble and the excursion included an open air lecture, with illustrations and hand specimens, in glorious weather overlooking Kenfig beach that the 24 participants

thoroughly enjoyed.

The August excursion to Freshwater West and West Angle Bay in Pembrokeshire also enjoyed superb weather. Despite coinciding with the Bank Holiday weekend 27 members attended and enjoyed a lovely day with John Nudds and Cindy Howells looking at the succession from the Ordovician up into the Pembrokeshire Limestone Group (Carboniferous). They also managed to time our arrival at West Angle to coincide with a fly past of an old Catalina Flying Boat!

Please note that the excursion to Llyn Brianne scheduled for Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> October has had to be postponed until next year and that the first lecture of the indoor session now takes place on this date.

## Last event of the summer programme 2013



**Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September: Mynydd Llangynidr, near Trefil**

**Leader: Alan Bowring (Fforest Fawr Geopark)**

Mynydd Llangynidr is a world-class interstratal karst site as recently recognised by its SSSI designation. The excursion will entail walking a circuit of many of the more interesting karstic features from Trefil, north past Llyn y Garn-fawr and Chartist Cave, passing from the Twrch Sandstone onto the limestone outcrop, and to the Neath Disturbance before heading back south in a circular fashion. The walk is approximately 9.5km/6miles although it can be

varied on the day according to the weather and the inclinations of the group! We should be back at the cars for between 4pm and 5pm.

Meet at Trefil (SO 122 128) for a 10am start. To get there, turn right up the sweeping hill in the heart of Trefil village and park where the northwestern end of the former tram road (modern bridleway) meets the road at the top corner. Much of the area lies at around 1700ft /530m above sea level and is very exposed so it is essential to come prepared for inclement weather. A packed lunch is also required.

## Winter Session 2013/2014



The winter programme gets off to a chilly start in Swansea on **Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> October** when Ian Skilling (University of South Wales) will deliver a lecture entitled *Hot and Cold: volcanic eruptions beneath ice*. With the impact such eruptions can have on our everyday life, such as the chaos caused to air traffic in northern Europe the other year, this should be a fascinating start to the session.



The cold theme continues at the meeting in Cardiff on **Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> October** when Brian Williams will talk to us on *The Last Great Ice Age: the Permo-Carboniferous of Gondwana*. At this meeting Brian will be presented with his Honorary

membership of the Group in recognition of all that he has done for us over the years.



The final meeting of 2013 is in Swansea on **Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> December** when Andy Gale will deliver the T.R.Owen memorial Lecture on the *Evolution and history of starfishes*. This was the talk that Andy was due to give last year before the snow put an end to his visit. Being the pre-Christmas lecture you can expect mince pies and Christmas Cake with your tea and coffee!



The New Year begins with our annual **Holiday Geology** meeting in the National Museum Cardiff on **Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> January**. This is always a very popular day when you get the chance to give short



presentations about your excursions at home and abroad or things of interest that you have seen over the preceding year. The content of this day is very much in the hands of our members so this is my first request for volunteers to give a short talk/slide show on the day. I have had a couple of offers so far, including a China update from Howard Bartlett, but I need at least 8 to 10 speakers to fill the day so don't be shy, volunteer! The first lecture meeting of the New Year takes place on **Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> January** in Cardiff when Bob Owens will talk on *The Geology of Mars*. With the fascinating data coming from the Mars Rover this will be a great chance to get up to date with the interpretation of the geological history of this amazing planet.



We come back down to earth and also onto the hot topic of fracking at our joint meeting with the South Wales Group of the Geological Society on **Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> February** in Swansea, when Joe

Cartwright will talk on *Fracking: mythology, propaganda and geomechanics*. The talk will outline the scientific background to fracking, and try to probe beneath the mythology and propaganda that has abounded in recent years as part of the public debate on the rights and wrongs of this technology.



The final indoor meeting of the session, our AGM, takes place in Cardiff on **Saturday 22nd March** and is followed by the President's Address. Geraint has chosen the wide ranging topic of *The World of Geology*. The actual content is a bit of a mystery at the moment but, as is to be expected from Geraint, it is bound to be a fascinating and enjoyable end to the indoor session and to his term as President.
