Field Meetings:

This summer's field meetings have generally been well attended and been blessed with generally good weather. In June, Dick Waters gave a review and update of the local Early Dinantian sediments between Barry and Cardiff, a subject area that we have not covered for many years. A week later we hosted the Rockwatch Welsh Weekend in Gower, the first time that most of the participants had ever been to Gower. They were most impressed! The excursion was attended by families from across the UK and my thanks go to John Davies and Hazel Trenbirth for leading the Sunday's excursion for me.

July saw us examining the Quaternary of the Black Mountains with Adrian Humpage. The weather was far better than forecast although the low cloud did restrict the 360° view point at

the first locality to 20m in all directions. We spent a fascinating day in and around the Honddu valley looking at the latest interpretation of its Quaternary history. Later that month saw us undertake our first specifically family orientated field trip to Penarth and Lavernock led by Christian Baars. Although the turn-out from families was poor we had a very informative excursion on a beautiful, hot summer's day with Peter Hodges explaining some of the latest research and interpretation on the succession.

August saw us undertake a half day excursion to the Mumbles led by Hazel Trenbirth. Again we were blessed by lovely weather and had a fascinating tour around Mumbles to Bracelet and Limeslade bays and the good planning to have a cafe with a view over the sea for lunch. Due to the absence of a certain member there were less questions meaning that we had

an earlier finish!

Out of the Woods Festival

The Group undertook its very successful fossil bash activity at the Out of the Woods Festival in Sophia Gardens on 17th August. We spent a very busy day helping the young and old break open large lumps of Coal Measures mudstone and identifying the plant fossils that they uncovered. 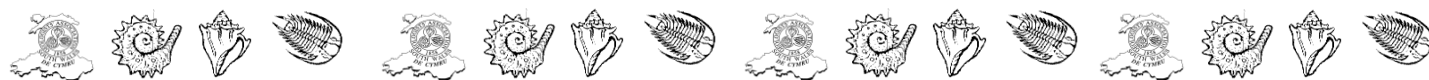
News from the Committee

**Obituary - Dr John CW Baker**

Members will have been saddened to hear of the death of former Chairman, Dr John Christian Wellstood Baker, on 24 March in Wokingham, age 87. His funeral was on 16 April in Rhiwbina and Thornhill.

John was one of our longest standing members. He was first involved with the Group in 1963, when he led a field visit to Monmouthshire and Gloucestershire. He was Chairman from 1968-1970, and Vice Chairman 1970-75. His retiring Chairman's address in 1970 was "In Wales before the Cambrian".

John was a member for 25 years. He gave

two talks, led five field excursions, wrote one of the contributions to the first SWGA guide book Geological Excursions in South Wales and the Forest of Dean (1971), and to the Glamorgan Heritage Coast guide later in the 1970s. His topics, relating to South Wales and the Welsh borders, were very varied. He supported many of our talks during the last two decades, including the "Wales in Miniature" conference in memory of Douglas A Bassett in May 2011 at St Fagan's. He was a long standing member of the staff at Cardiff University Geology Department. Our sincere condolences go to his family, friends and colleagues.
